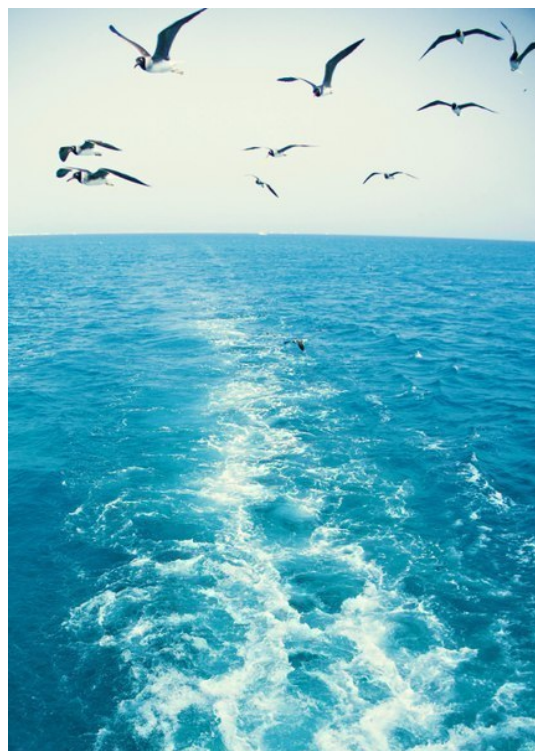


A Letter from the editor

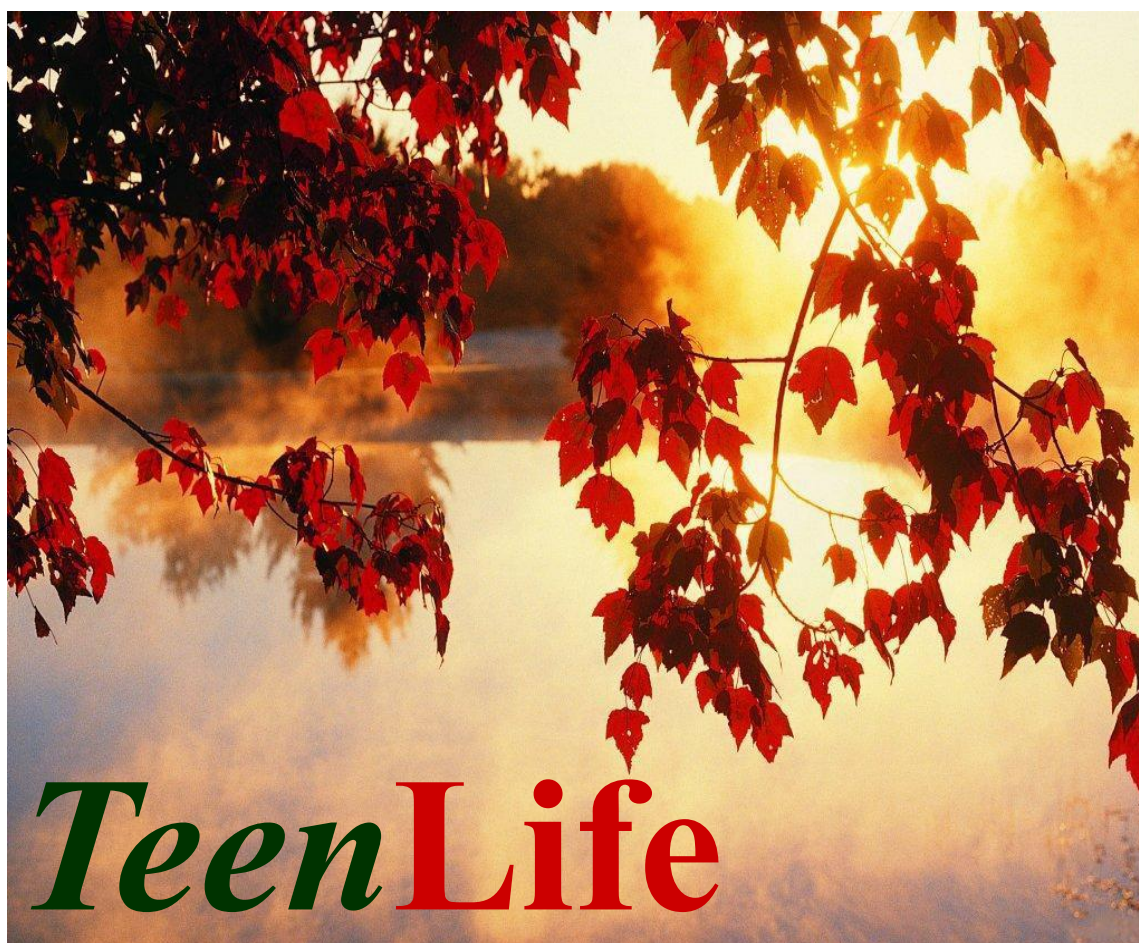

I'd felt in foreign ancient lands.

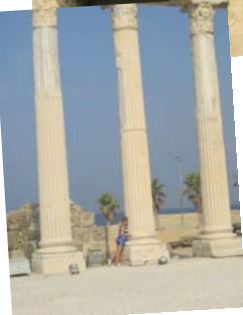
The holidays have passed so quickly,

Golden Mountains of Altai

Altai... Peace and quiet... Pure air... Serene water... Pristine nature... Mysterious Rerich's signs... This place renowned for its marvelous energetic aura lets you restore the lost harmony with the surrounding world and reveal simple and eternal wisdom – nature is the key to perfection.

The Altai mountains in southern Siberia form the major mountain range in the western Siberia biogeographic region and provide the source of its greatest rivers – the Ob and the Irtysh. Three separate areas are inscribed: Altaisky Zapovednik and a buffer zone around Lake Teletskoye; Katunsky Zapovednik and a buffer zone around Mount Belukha; and the Ukok Quiet Zone on the Ukok plateau. The total area covers 1,611,457 ha. The region represents the most complete sequence of altitudinal vegetation zones in central Siberia, from steppe, forest-steppe, mixed forest, subalpine vegetation to alpine vegetation. Altai is also an important habitat for endangered animal species such as the snow leopard.

Katun is one of the major rivers at Altai, it's 688 km long and starts at the height of 2000



m at south Altai mountains, being fed by melting glaciers, smaller rivers, and Chuya river (along which passes Chuysky Trakt - the road to Mongolia). From far, Katun looks like a green river, that is because there's a lot of limestone in the water, so the light is reflected in a strange way. Katun is not very wide: closer to Gorno-Altaysk it is just 20-30 meters wide and up towards the stream it may be 50 meters wide. The stream in the river is quite strong, but it is possible to walk in at some places and swim a little bit, especially that the water during summer is not very cold. Katun is also great for fishing. The main attraction of Katun is that for years, since the Soviet times, it has been a mecca for water tourism and rafting trips. Katun has a wide range of rapids of all kinds and complexities. It is a good place both for beginners and advanced rafters. There are a few annual rafting championships taking place at Katun.

I've been to Altai for four times. I saw almost all its splendid places. I admire its beauty and strength. And I'd like to come to Altai again.

Russia – Our Homeland

Russia, currently known as the Russian Federation, is considered to be the largest country in the world, spanning more than an eighth of the world's mass area. Since the establishment of the Russian Empire in the 18th Century, and the country's role as the power stronghold of the Soviet Union Russia has been considered one of the world's superpowers, and has remained the largest state in the modern world.

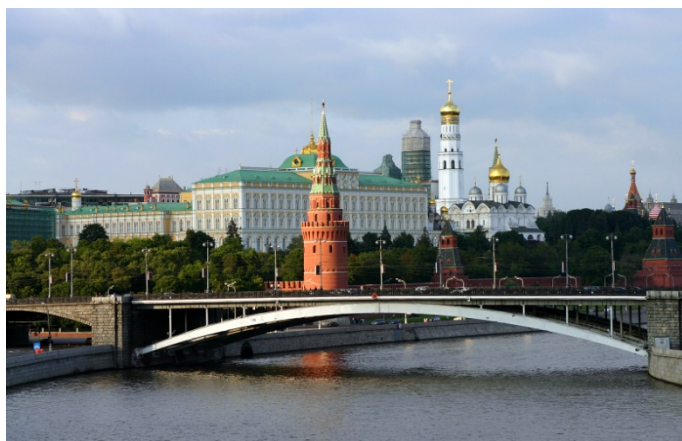


The history of Russia has been a rollercoaster ride of Vikings, Tzars, and nuclear weapons, and has continued to serve as one of the most interesting historical specimens to this day. Russia gave the world beautiful names of Pushkin and Lermontov, Chaikovsky and Repin thousands of names of world famous poets, writers, composers, scientists. Russia occupies about one-seventh part of dry land. It is situated in Europe and in Asia. Its total area is over 17 million square

kilometers, with population of 200 million people. There are 1,030 towns and cities in our country. Moscow, with 9,5 million people, is its capital. The country is washed by the Arctic Ocean in the north and the Pacific Ocean in the east. There are many rivers in Russia. The largest rivers are the Volga in Europe and the Yenisei and the Ob' in Asia. The deepest lakes are Baikal and Ladoga. The relief of Russia is mostly flat. Russia is located on two

plains: the Great Russian Plain and the Western Siberian Plain. There are three main mountain chains in Russia. The Caucasus is a range of mountains which extends from the Black Sea to the Caspian Sea. The highest mountain in Caucasus in Russian Federation and in the whole Europe is Mount Elbrus. The Urals extend from the Arctic Ocean to the steppes. This mountain chain divides the European and Asian parts of Russia. The Urals are famous for their valuable minerals. There are 150 volcanoes in Kamchatka, 30 of which are active. The Russian Federation is very rich in mineral resources, such as oil, natural gas, coal, iron, gold and others.

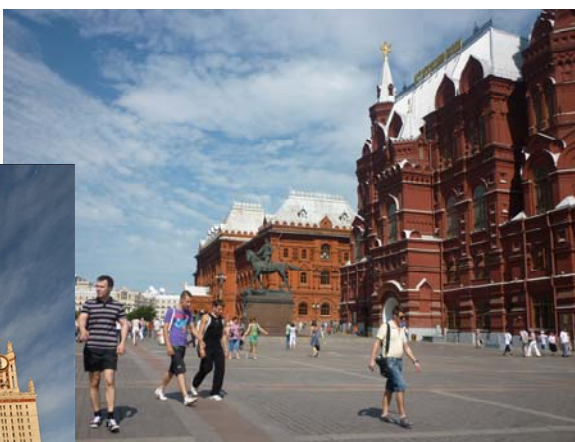




Russia borders with fourteen countries including the former republics of the USSR, which are now independent states. Russia borders with Estonia, Latvia, Finland, Poland, China, Mongolia, Korea, Japan, Kazakhstan and so on. Today Russia is one of the world's largest grain producers and exporters. So, today Russia is a great industrial country. The main cities of Russia are: Moscow, St. Petersburg, Krasnoyarsk, Ufa, Perm, Rostov-on-Don, Vladivostok. Many villages in Russia are famous for their specific crafts: painted boxes in Palkn, wooden tableware in Khokhloma, and toys in Dymkovo. Moscow is the capital of Russia. It is one of the biggest and most beautiful cities in the world. Moscow is a modern city. It's Russian political center, here the government of our country is working. Moscow is called the port of five seas, as the Volga Canal links Moscow with the Baltic, White, Caspian, Black sea and the Sea of Azov. Moscow is also Russian cultural center. Mein unvergeßlicher Urlaub in Deutschland



In diesem Sommer hatte ich Glück, Deutschland zu besuchen. Das geschah Anfang August. Eine Gruppe von Deutschlehrern, die aus 13 Menschen bestand, flog mit einem Flugzeug durch Frankfurt am Main nach Stuttgart. Stuttgart ist die Hauptstadt eines der Bundesländer der BRD Baden-Württemberg. Von hier aus fuhren wir mit einem Auto nach Bad Liebenzell, dem wunderschönen Städtchen



inmitten des Schwarzwaldes. Hier steht eine Burg, wo wir wohnten. Von dem Turm der Burg konnten wir eine wunderbare Ansicht der Stadt- und Berglandschaft bewundern.
