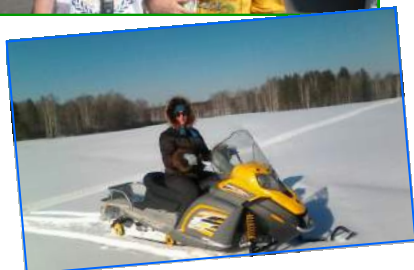

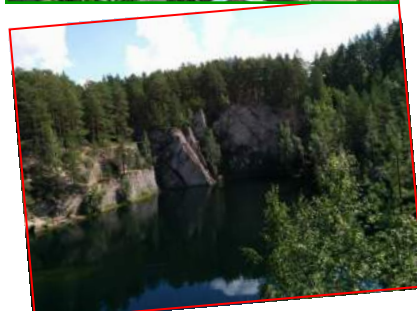
The world is bright and full of marvels.

Bashkir and Tatar Cuisine

Tatar cuisine is a culinary journey in time, from the Finno-Ugric peoples to the Golden Horde, with occasional visits to the Khazars and the Bulgars. I want to tell you about a few dishes.

Kystyby. It is a delicate stuffed flat bread folded in the form of a soft half-moon and a relic recipe that comes from the forests, fields and archeological burial mounds of the mid-Volga region. Unleavened flat breads are baked on a dry pan, greased with melted butter and then stuffed with millet porridge or mashed potatoes. It has a velvety texture and a pure refined taste.

Belish is a small pastry. Zur-belish is a large pie. And zur-belish with goose is a true feast. This kind of pie is usually prepared

only for family celebrations and very special guests. And at the same time, they are not very difficult to cook.

I found a little cookbook "Bayram: Bashkir and Tatar Cuisine", with plenty of inspiring recipes and attractive pictures.

Zur belish Yields 1 pie (8 servings)

500 g peeled potatoes, large dice
duck forcemeat
40 g canola oil
200 g peeled onions, sliced
salt
black pepper
0.8 g star anise
pie crust
duck confit
50 g butter
duck stock
40 g duck liver

The Red

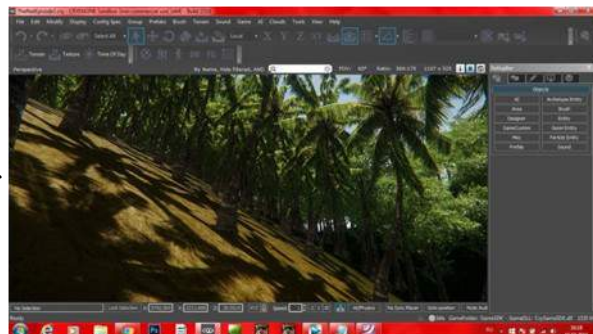
Boys and girls from my school like to play computer games so much! I am fond of computer games and IT technologies, too. Therefore I decided to create a computer game myself. It is called "The Red".

My Panda

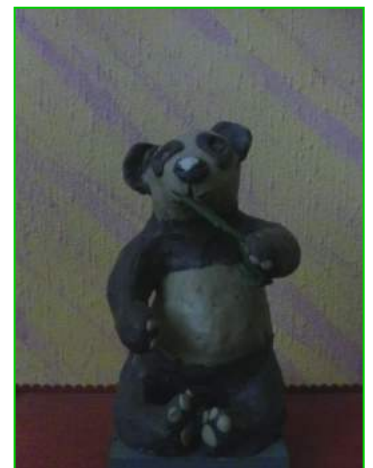
Panda is a unique animal. Scientists all over the world make researches about them, because they don't have much in common with bears.

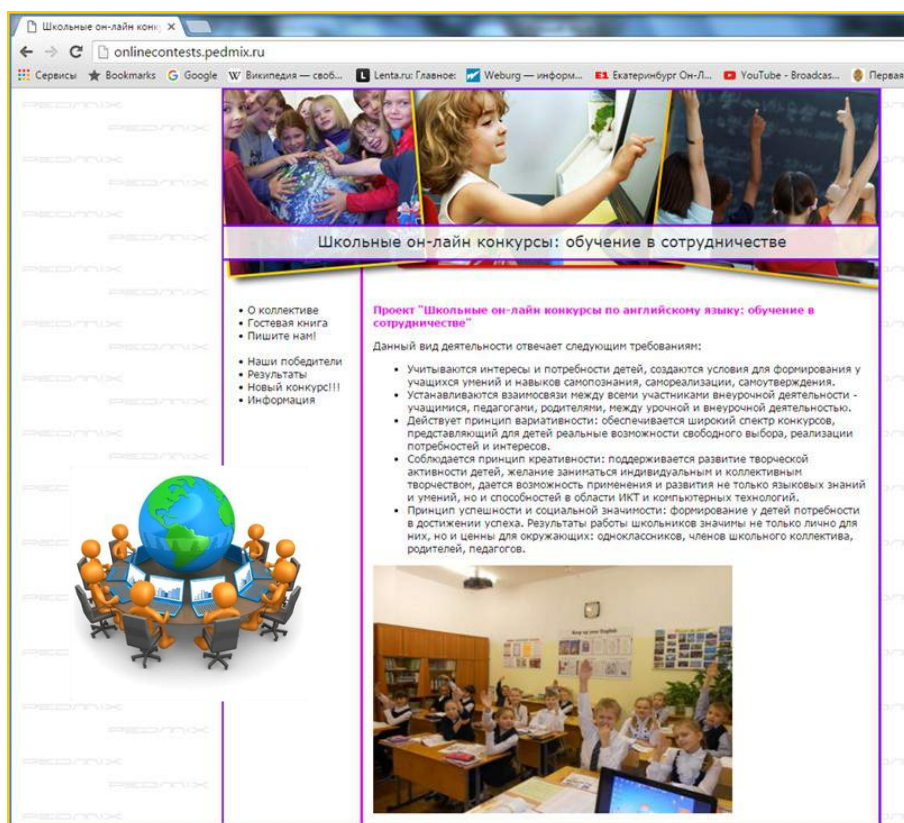

How flowers changed the world

Once upon a time there were no flowers at all.

A little while ago - about one hundred million years, as the geologist estimates time in the history of our four-billion-year-old planet - flowers were not to be found anywhere on the five continents. Wherever one might have looked, from the poles to the equator, one would have seen only the cold dark monotonous green of a world whose plant life possessed no other color.

Somewhere, just a short time before the close of the Age of Reptiles, there occurred a soundless, violent explosion. It lasted millions of years, but it was an explosion, nevertheless. It marked the emergence of the angiosperms - the flowering plants. Even the great evolutionist, Charles Darwin, called them "an abominable mystery," because they appeared so suddenly and spread so fast.

Flowers changed the face of the planet. Without them, the world we know - even man himself - would never have existed. Francis Thompson, the English poet, once wrote that one could not pluck a flower without troubling a star. Intuitively he had sensed like a naturalist the enormous interlinked complexity of life. Today we know that the appearance of the flowers contained also the equally mystifying emergence of man. . . .

A high metabolic rate and the maintenance of a constant body

temperature are supreme achievements in the evolution of life. They enable an animal to escape, within broad limits, from the overheating or the chilling of its immediate surroundings, and at the same time to maintain a peak mental efficiency. Creatures without a high metabolic rate are slaves to weather. Insects in the first frosts of autumn all run down like little clocks. Yet if you pick one up and breathe warmly upon it, it will begin to move about once more. . .

A high metabolic rate, however, means a heavy intake of energy in order to sustain body warmth and efficiency. It is for this reason that even some of these later warm-blooded mammals existing in our day have learned to descend into a slower, unconscious rate of living during the winter months when food may be difficult to obtain. On a slightly higher plane they are following the procedure of the cold-blooded frog sleeping in the mud at the bottom of a frozen pond.

The agile brain of the warm-blooded birds and mammals demands a high oxygen consumption and food in concentrated forms, or the creatures cannot long sustain themselves. It was the rise of the flowering plants that provided that energy and changed the nature of the living world. Their appearance parallels in a quite surprising manner the rise of the birds and mammals.



Как цветы

Где-то к концу Века рептилий, произошел сильный, но беззвучный взрыв. Он длился миллионы лет, но, тем не менее, это был взрыв. Он ознаменовал появление покрытосеменных цветущих растений. Даже великий эволюционист Чарльз Дарвин назвал их «отвратительной тайной», потому что они появлялись так внезапно и очень быстро распространялись.

Цветы изменили лицо планеты. Без них мир, который мы знаем, и даже сами люди, не существовали бы. Францис Томпсон – английский поэт однажды написал, что нельзя сорвать цветок, не задев звезду. Интуитивно он, как натуралист, почувствовал огромную взаимосвязь между разными аспектами жизни. Сегодня мы знаем, что появление цветов равнозначно таинственному появлению человека. . . .

Высокий уровень метаболизма и поддержание постоянной температуры тела являются высшими достижениями в эволюции жизни. Они позволяют животным избежать перегрева или переохлаждения от окружающей среды и, в тоже время,

Shakespeare's ENGLAND 2016

Shakespeare's Home

2016 commemorates 400 years since the death of William Shakespeare; this special anniversary year is a truly unique opportunity to visit his home town Stratford-upon-Avon in Warwickshire to celebrate the lasting legacy of the world's greatest playwright. Start planning your visit to Shakespeare's England in 2016 to see one of his plays performed at the Royal Shakespeare Company, tour his Birthplace, pay your respects at his grave at Holy Trinity Church or simply walk in his footsteps and explore the place he called home.

William Shakespeare, a famous English poet, playwright, and actor, was born on 26 April 1564 in Stratford-upon-Avon. He is often called England's national poet and nicknamed the Bard of Avon.

He wrote about 38 plays, 154 sonnets, two long narrative poems, and a few other verses. His plays have been translated into every major living language and are per-

formed more often than those of any other playwright.

Between 1585 and 1592, he began a successful career in London as an actor, writer, and part-owner of a playing company called the Lord Chamberlain's Men, later known as the King's Men.

Around 1613, at the age of 49, he retired to Stratford, where he died three years later. Few records of

Shakespeare's private life survive. He died on 23 April 1616, at the age of 52.

Shakespeare's plays remain highly popular today and are constantly studied, performed, and reinterpreted in diverse cultural and political contexts throughout the world.

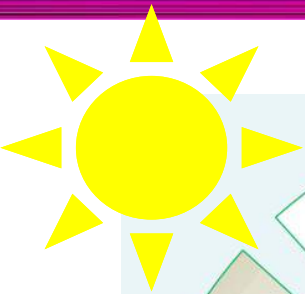

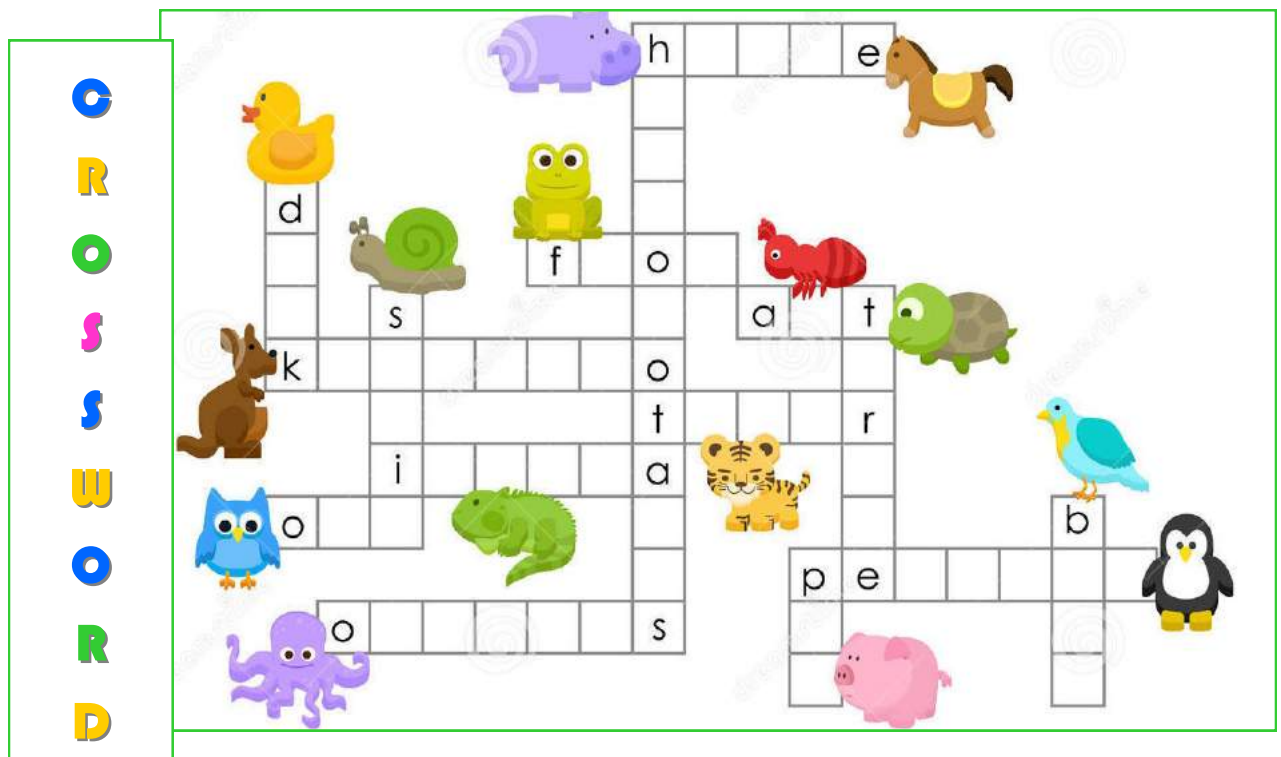
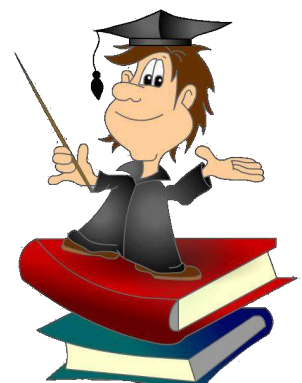
